

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held in the Village Hall, Barmby Moor

Present: Councillors Gregory (JG), Vass (DV), Clarke (SC), Dexter (ND), J. Shepherd (JS), Smith (MS), Haynes (CH – Chair), Strangeway (AS – Pocklington Provincial), West (KW – Pocklington Provincial), G. Shephard (GS). Jody Nightingale (ERYC - Trading Standards Officer – Cold Calling). Two members of the public: Elizabeth Pepper and Isabel Malin.

Apologies: Councillor Hill (RH).

Declaration of Interests from members on any item to be discussed: MS on his invoice under Finance.

Cold Calling - CH welcomed Mr. Nightingale to the meeting who gave a presentation on Cold Calling. Two members of the public Mrs. Malin and Mrs. Pepper also attended as having an interest.

Mr. Nightingale explained that ERYC had been forming Cold Calling Zones for 12 years the first pilot scheme being in Beverley. There are 950 NCZ in the East Riding from a whole village to a street of 4 or 5 houses. There had only been one failure in Wetwang.

100% of houses in the proposed areas need to be consulted with either letters or petitions. Once ERYC are happy with the outcome they will approve the areas giving every householder a door sticker with information on where to ask for help and a NCZ sign within the zone.

Questions asked by all, and members decided to discuss this issue up at the Annual Parish meeting to consult other areas of the parish. Mrs. Malin & Mrs. Pepper are happy to commence pilot areas at Sutton Lane and Main Street.

Mr. Nightingale was thanked by CH for attending then left the meeting.

Clerk's Report:

Anonymous letter – PC cannot write to someone who does not submit their name. The manure heap near the pumping station is on corrugated metal. JG said the manure will not contaminate the watercourse and would be similar to putting manure on farm land. Members have checked the car parking at Holborn Estate and found no concerns.

Jesfield – building works have commenced including the new access road across the VG.

Shrub on VG – JG confirmed minimal pruning has been carried out.

Matters Arising:

Condition of road in Main Street – Cllr. Burton confirmed repair works have been carried out in Main Street (B1246), and surface dressing expected in April.

Pipe and drainage development adjacent to B1246 BM to Pocklington – Cllr. A. Burton and Enforcement Officers are observing the works, which expect to be landscaped and reinstated to the original condition except for the detention basin and access road. Maps observed at the meeting.

A1079 resurfacing of carriageway through BM parish – RH sent a letter to Mike Medcalf, ERYC Civil Engineering Services asking for further resurfacing on the A1079. Letter acknowledged confirming at the present time there will be no further requests due to budgetary constraints.

Fields in Trust – proposed by JS and seconded by MS to go ahead protecting the Play Park, motion carried. First step is for the clerk to send ownership proof of the PP to Fields in Trust for them to check if we are eligible.

State of driveway at St. Kildas and Cedar Lodge – JG will ask the owners of the two properties if they are prepared to fund the work, and give the measurements of the driveways proposed.

Barmby Moor School parking – AS confirmed the proposal to tarmac the grass verges adjacent to the school with lay-bys is due to be discussed at an ERYC Funding Priority Committee. Members would prefer the entire side be tarmacked if possible to avoid further problems. AS to approach Highways.

Noise pollution and fly tipping on the Airfield – motor bike noise can be checked by Environmental Services if requested, they will enter a resident's garden during the scrambling. Members decided to monitor the events. Also over a hundred tyres have been fly-tipped on the same land which is private. GS proposed we write to Simon Pocklington to make him aware of the problems, seconded by JG and carried.

Onshore Oil & Gas – Fracking – little response from other Parish Councils. However an Anti-Fracking Group has been formed if members are interested in joining. Clerk waiting for the date of the next meeting.

Neighbourhood Development Plan – SC confirmed the document has been completed and will be ready for publishing ready for the Annual Parish meeting, when he will give a short presentation.

Plans:

Driver, Emerald Cottage, The Green – erection of single storey extension to rear following demolition of conservatory (**Ref: 17/00468/PLF**) – no observations.

Stubley, Barn Cottage, The Green – erection of single storey sun room & erection of timber 2 bay car ports following demolition of existing garage, garden shed and decking area (**Ref: 17/00157/PLF**) – no observations.

Bovingdon, Heatherdene, Hull Road – change of use from domestic garage to holiday cottage including internal and addition of new windows and doors (**Ref: 17/00263/PLF**) – Object and strongly request that a Planning Officer visits the site as the development appears to have other accommodation other than Heatherdene noted on this site.

Please can we draw attention to the following restrictions on a previous application DC/01001/PLF/WESTWW.

"The detached garage hereby approved shall not be used at any time for purposes other than those purposes ancillary to the residential use of the single dwelling known as Heatherdene, Hull Road, Barmby Moor.

The condition is imposed because it is considered that the use of the development needs to be restricted as the building is within the open countryside where new development is carefully controlled by national and local planning policies".

Tree Works:

White, James Close – TPO Barmby Moor – crown lifting 4 Sycamores, Trees A, B, C, and D removing ivy and works on branches. Felling Robinia at rear which is 20 feet from house, and felling smallest pine at the front of the property (**Ref: 17/00392/TPO**) - *Members are concerned about the wildlife in this area. However, if the Tree Officer approves all the work on this application, they are happy to agree and give their support.*

Saunders, Laurels Farm – fell cherry and reduce Leylandi crown to 10 ft. high (**Ref: 17/00298/TCA**) – no observations.

Barmby Moor C of E Primary School – thank you letter for £50 grant.

Asset Register 2016/2017 – register updated, approved by JS and seconded by DV, and carried.

Adoption of Annual Return – ERNLLCA informing PC's they will be exempted from forwarding an Annual Return for 2017. Information to follow from ERNLLCA on how to progress.

St. Catherine's Church grant – Members wanted clarification on the grant needed by the church for heating. Clerk to contact Revd. Hardy and the Treasurer, for further information. JG proposed that we have a separate meeting on grants and on the best way to invest. JS proposed £60,000 be put aside for investing.

Proposed by SC we organise another meeting date, which will be the 6 April at 7.30 pm.

Correspondence:

ERYC Community Transport Strategy 2016-2020 Launch Event - 24 March at Bishop Burton College, no one can attend.

Street Naming and Numbering Section – Proposed name of the Jesfield development is: "St. Catherine's Close". There was a long discussion by members on other names such as Hackney Close (name of an airman in the cemetery) and Pooley. **Conclusion:** members decided on St. Catherine's Close as historical to the site. This was proposed by MS, seconded by JG and carried with one abstention. GS stated the previous policy should be retained.

EYMC Buses – members invited to a meeting with Bob Rackley and Peter Ship of EYMS at the Old Courthouse, Pocklington. GS or SC will try and attend.

102 Squadron Re-union – on the 6th and 7th May as Wolds Gliding Club. Members also agreed to become Associate members of the 102 Squadron. RH cannot attend the wreath ceremony, CH or JS will check dates to deputise RH for the wreath laying.
