Parish Update

2017 Parish Council meeting dates – 20 April (Annual Parish meeting), 25 May (Annual General meeting), 13 July, 24 August, 5 October, 16 November and 14 December. Please note the change of meeting day to a Thursday, and at the moment meetings will commence at 7.00 pm.

Annual Parish meeting on 20 April 2017 in the Village Hall to commence at 7.00 pm – this is the meeting when local residents are invited to attend and enter in to discussion on issues relating to the parish. **Please come along, it will be lovely to see a well-attended meeting.**

Cold Calling – the Parish Council have decided to carry out two pilot schemes for Cold Calling in Barmby Moor. One will be in Sutton Lane, with the help of Elizabeth Pepper, and Main Street with the help of Isabel Malin. This issue will also be discussed at the Annual Parish meeting, when hopefully the views of local residents in other parts of the parish might be included.

Jody Nightingale from East Riding of Yorkshire Council Trading Standards, will be coming to the Community Coffee Morning at **the Boot & Slipper on Wednesday, 3 of May at 10.00 am.** His talk will alert people to the dangers of ‘scamming’ and also how to make areas of Barmby Moor into “No Cold Calling Zones” if people so wish.

Barmby Moor Neighbourhood Development Plan - The Neighbourhood Development Plan Steering Committee intend to give an update and brief report at the Annual Parish meeting, and take questions.

The report analysing and explaining results of the questionnaire issued in connection with the Barmby Moor Neighbourhood Plan, is now completed and can be downloaded from the

Parish Council's website. Copies can also be requested to be sent by email (or hard copy) from the Parish Clerk and a hard copy will be available in the Boot & Slipper, which can be read on the premises.

Condition of the road in Main Street (B1246) – Councillor A. Burton ERYC has confirmed that after the repairs have been completed, surface dressing will be carried out during April.

Post Office next to the new development - a great improvement to the access road to the Post Office. This was agreed at the same time as the easement across the village green was requested.

Photographs of the village – a big thank you to Barry Malin for taking photographs of the village, which will be put on the Parish Council website in the near future. Also Barmby Moor will be included on ERNLLCA's website (East Riding and North Lincolnshire Local Councils Association).

Grass verges – the highway verges are extremely wet with surface water at this time of year. You may have noticed the terrible erosion to the grassed areas damaged by vehicles and car parking. Please do not park on the village green or highway verges, we have such a pretty village, do keep it neat and tidy.

Village Awareness of the Defibrillator – this is something we can discuss at the Annual Parish Meeting. Would members of the public like to be included in a training course on how to use the defibrillator by the Ambulance Services?

Barmby Moor School Parking (Holborn Estate) – We are waiting to see if the verges surrounding the village school will receive funding. Councillor Andy Strangeway has confirmed this issue will be discussed at the next Asset Strategy Team meeting, and will be considered as part of the funding prioritisation for next year's highways funding allocation. Let's hope this will be achieved for 2017/2018.

Play Park, Main Street – the PC has submitted a grant request for new play equipment from WREN. This will be for multi-play equipment for young and older children.
