Parish Update

Play Park, Main Street re-opens:

The Play Park situated in Main Street, Barmby Moor is now up and running following the Installation of new play equipment by Sovereign Design Play Systems Limited in Essex. The Captain Mannering equipment has two slides, two poles and climbing walls plus towers and gangplank joining the towers together. It is also surrounded by grass tiles for safety purposes. Other facilities on the park include infant swings, another slide, a basket swing and a parallel bar.

The new facility which was funded by a £9769.38 grant from WREN's Community Action Fund. Penny Beaumont, Grant Manager from WREN is delighted that the project is now in use.

Barmby Moor Parish Council says" This vital facility is going to make a real difference to those who use it, as well as the wider community to Barmby Moor parish. We are extremely grateful to WREN for providing funding as we would not have been able to go ahead without their support.

WREN is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community, conservation and heritage projects from funds donated by FCC Environment through the Landfill Communities Fund.

Proposed Barmby Moor Volunteer Group – In the last Parish update the Parish Council asked if anyone in the parish would like to join a Volunteer Group who would be prepared to spend a few hours per month, helping with tasks such as looking after the verges, planting out boxes and borders, trimming hedges and litter picking etc. If you are interested, please contact Councillor David Vass on: david.vass@virgin.net or phone: 306795.

Telephone Kiosk or the new Red Box Library – thank you to Felicity Baumont for sorting out the books in the kiosk making it a very attractive library to use in the village. Please do use this facility, by adding or borrowing books.

No Cold Calling in the village – are there any other areas of the village interested in becoming a No Cold Calling Zone? Sutton Lane and Main Street have been adopted, and presently The Laurels is being canvassed by a parishioner. Once approved local residents can put a sticker in their window provided by the Trading Standards Department, informing door step sellers they are not wanted and are committing an offence. Also No Cold Calling Zone signs will be erected in their street. Just give the clerk a ring in you are interested.

Bus Shelter – the Parish Council are in the process of ordering a bus shelter, to be sited at the bus stop on the A1079 opposite Kimberley House. Also they are waiting for approval of siting a litter bin in the same lay-by.

Christmas Lights – last year there were many more Christmas lights in people's windows, especially in Main Street. Let's repeat this again this year proving Barmby Moor is full of Christmas cheer.

Parking on the grass verges – please do not park vehicles on the grass verges and village greens. Winter is here, rain is making the ground soft which means churned up and disappearing grassed areas in the village.
